BARC Global Central Laboratory to Support the First International NASH Day to Increase Awareness around NAFLD and NASH.

BARC Global Central Lab, a division of Cerba HealthCare, is proud to announce its support to the First International NASH Information Day on June 12, 2018. This day is launched by the NASH Education ProgramTM to raise awareness around NAFLD and NASH and address unmet needs associated with this pathology.



NAFLD is affecting 25% of the global adult population and is the most common chronic liver disease worldwide. NASH, being the active form of NAFLD, has become the 2nd leading cause of end-stage liver disease and hepatocellular carcinoma (HCC) in the USA. However, being a 'silent' liver disease, the pathology remains poorly known and under-diagnosed. As such, there is an obvious need to increase awareness around both NAFLD and NASH, as there is a growing number of patients developing NASH-related end-stage liver disease and no registered treatment yet for NASH.

The NASH Education ProgramTMis launching the first International NASH Information Day on June 12, 2018. This first-of-its-kind initiative is inaugurated to increase awareness around NASH and intended to reach the general public, more specifically individuals at risk, patients and their families, on a global scale. The event is organized with the support of a coalition of more than 20 organizations joining forces at a global scale. Moreover, 150 KOLs in the field, have signed a call-to-action.

"NAFLD is a serious modern epidemic that can be mitigated when diagnosed early. We are proud to support the NASH awareness and to participate in one of the biggest global clinical programs to find a cure to this disease", commented Mario PAPILLON, Chief Executive Officer, BARC, on the initiative.

Pieter BOGAERT, Chief Scientific Officer of BARC added "These are exciting times to be at the forefront of NASH drug development; current advancements in simplifying the diagnosis and unraveling the mechanisms underlying the progression of NAFLD to NASH have made clear that clinical studies should be supported by multidisciplinary laboratory analyses."
